4 ORS 677.188(4)(a) any conduct or practice contrary to recognized standards of ethics of the
5 profession.

7 Licensee and the Board desire to settle this matter by the entry of this Stipulated Order.
8 Licensee understands that he has the right to a contested case hearing under the Administrative
9 Procedures Act (Oregon Revised Statutes chapter 183) and, by the signing and issuance of this
10 Order, Licensee fully and finally waives the right to a contested case hearing, understands and
11 acknowledges that this order is not subject to judicial review, acknowledges and agrees that this
12 Order was signed freely, without fraud or duress, and acknowledges and agrees the grounds to
13 petition for the stipulated order to be set aside under ORS 183.417(3)(b) do not exist in this case.
14 Licensee neither admits nor denies, but the Board finds that Licensee engaged in conduct as
15 described in the On July 26, 2024, Notice of Proposed Disciplinary Action, and that this conduct
16 violated the Medical Practice Act, to wit ORS 677.190(13); ORS 677.190(20); ORS 677.190(4);
17 ORS 677.190(17); and ORS 677.190(1)(a), as defined in ORS 677.188(4)(a) and ORS
18 677.188(4)(c). Licensee understands that this Order is a public record and is a disciplinary
19 action that is reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank and the Federation of State
20 Medical Boards.

22 Licensee and the Board agree that the Board will close and resolve all current matters
23 [REDACTED] before the Board regarding Licensee by entry of this
24 Stipulated Order, subject to the following conditions:

- 25 4.1 Licensee surrenders his Oregon medical license while under investigation.
26 4.2 Licensee must not reapply for a medical license in the State of Oregon for at least
27 two years from the effective date of this Order.
